Meg Braff is not only a successful businesswoman, she is also a busywife and mother of four boys. Whether she is designing for city or resort clients or tending to home and hearth, Meg seems to juggle it all with grace, humon and charm.

This winter, you may not make it to a fashionable resort in the tropics, but with Braff's classic collection of wallpapers and fabrics now available, you can perhaps recreate some semblance of her fabulous, noteworthy designs in your home. M
